President Robert Carlson called the meeting to order at approximately 11:08 a.m. Added to the Consent Agenda under Approve was item 5, Addition of Brian Mort to the Broadband and Advanced Technology Committee and added to New Business was a request to the Elks to sound dampen the EDC's offices.

#### PROGRESS REPORTS—

**EDC.** Steve Renquist reported \$10 million was received for the BNSF Railway wye project and \$3.75 has been added to the state bonding bill for the project, part of which is for a spur into the Willmar Industrial Park; a possible sale of Bethesda's Heritage building for 47-49 three-, two- and one-bedroom market rate apartments is moving forward; he is working with an individual from the Karen community on opening an Asian food market; a local company with a trucking operation is looking at a major expansion; a company is looking at moving into Kandiyohi County with approximately 100 jobs; and he is working with communities in the county on specific needs. Connie Schmoll gave an update of the projects on which she has been working (see attached).

## [Bruce Peterson joined the meeting.]

Schmoll reported the EDC's new website is nearly complete; the Marketing and Public Relations Committee is working on publishing quarterly flyers rather than a newspaper insert twice a year; and the County Board of Commissioners approved the match for the Blandin grant application to do a broadband feasibility study.

Willmar. Bruce Peterson reported he is doing year-end cleanup of projects; permitting continues and he estimated construction values to be in the mid-\$40 million range; the largest projects next year are tax-exempt projects; a non-county business is looking at moving its operations to Willmar with approximately 30 employees and a \$1.5 million facility with offices and maintenance facilities; a current business is looking at a 12-acre site in the new Willmar Industrial Park; he continues to fine tune routing questions for the wye project; the Federal Aviation Administration has now stated it may take one year to obtain the land release of the former airport property; land use and nuisance issues were high in 2015 with approximately 1,000 complaints—most end in compliance, but several are prosecuted for ordinance violations and on some occasions, the city retains a company to clean up the property and files a lien against the property.

Tax abatement. Renquist discussed a letter he sent on a tax abatement request for MinnWest Technology Campus (MWTC) (see attached) and believes this board should discuss its position on an EDC employee recommending tax abatement. Peterson stated Jim Sieben disclosed corporate data in support of MWTC's tax abatement request to the Willmar City Council and five of the six council members voted in favor of the request. Renquist noted he has no problem supporting a tax abatement for a project that will bring in high-paying jobs and a certain number of employees. Schmoll stated other communities are willing to offer incentives to have companies move to their community. Peterson believes it is important that when an EDC employee goes to a taxing entity, they have the support of the board. Peterson noted he has appeared before the county and the school board to make recommendations and to share the City's position. It is believed staff has free reign to do what they feel is important on behalf of the EDC as there is no policy. Peterson stated Renquist attended the Willmar City Council's public hearing and presented information about the tax abatement and does not believe he represented this board at those hearings. Peterson stated it is generally difficult to find fault with the numbers included in a tax abatement request as state statute gives the requirements and incentives have been used very judiciously by the taxing entities. Peterson stated the city will begin to collect a little over \$50,000 from MWTC's real estate taxes previously abated and Kandiyohi County will begin collecting \$80,000+ and every dollar of additional expansion taxes will be collected. Renquist stated MWTC believes it will add

more than 175 jobs. Tax abatement, in general, was discussed. Peterson noted it is important for citizens to listen to the hearings on these types of projects so they receive factual, first-hand information.

IT WAS MOVED BY Rollie Boll, SECONDED BY Art Benson, to support the tax abatement request outlined in the December 8, 2015 letter for the MinnWest Technology Campus. MOTION CARRIED.

Board members requested the boards have additional discussion at their joint planning session on how future tax abatement requests are handled. Peterson stated he has never seen a board set policy on its staff advocating for projects and Renquist is not aware of any policy directing what the EDC's staff may or may not do in advocating for projects.

**2015 Strategic Plan.** Renquist noted an update to the Strategic Plan was provided to the board (see attached) and highlighted a few areas. Renquist invited board members to speak with staff if additional information is desired and suggested if the board would like to see any changes in how reporting is done in the future, now would be the time.

**Executive Director search.** Donna Boonstra reported the search committee has had a couple of meetings and interviewed one applicant this past Monday. The committee will screen five applicants next week and is excited about the applicants. Renquist informed the board that his last day of employment will be December 31, 2015. The Joint Powers Board has set tentative interview dates for the finalists on January 4, 7 or 8, 2016. Boonstra will ask if the interview questions will be available to this board. The interview questions were developed by the consultant with input by the search committee.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

**Staff health insurance.** Renquist reported the Joint Powers Board approved enrolling in a group health insurance plan with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Minnesota and retained the EDC's monthly contribution at \$850 per month, per employee. Schmoll informed the board she will be keeping the same plan as this year and the premium increase for 2016 will be less than presented because of enrolling in a group plan.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

**Soundproofing the offices.** Renquist informed the board that sound carries between the EDC's rooms. Boonstra was requested to bring the issue to this board. Kelly TerWisscha stated it is difficult to soundproof with a wild air exchange system—white noise can possibly be added.

IT WAS MOVED BY Linda Kacher, SECONDED BY Rollie Boll, to ask the Elks what it would take to mitigate the noise in the Kandiyohi County and City of Willmar Economic Development offices. MOTION CARRIED.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Finance.** Peterson reported the Finance Committee met this week and discussed a couple of loans. Renquist stated the committee recommended approval of one loan and tabled discussion of one until additional information has been provided.

IT WAS MOVED BY Kelly TerWisscha, SECONDED BY Donna Boonstra, to approve a five-year \$40,000 loan to Bonnema Hardware & Flooring, Inc. under the Kandiyohi County and City of Willmar Economic Development Commission's Revolving Loan Fund Program at 5.25% interest with a third position security interest. MOTION CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY Art Benson, SECONDED BY Linda Kacher, to approve extending interest-only payments through March 2016 on the loan to Peaceful Thymes under the Kandiyohi County and City of Willmar Economic Development Commission's Revolving Loan Fund Program. MOTION CARRIED.

**Agriculture and Renewable Energy Development.** Renquist invited the board to attend a presentation by EcoEngineers of Des Moines, Iowa, at the Ag Committee's next meeting on December 17, 2015.

RE: MINNWEST TECHNOLOGY CAMPUS TAX ABATEMENT

The MinnWest Technology Campus (MWTC) is requesting a 10-year 100% tax abatement of property taxes from the City of Willmar, Kandiyohi County and Willmar Public School District, ISD No. 347.

MWTC has been receiving a combination of Job Opportunity Zone (JOBZ) benefits and tax abatement on the portion of its property that was not JOBZ eligible. The JOBZ program and present tax abatement sunsets on December 31, 2015. The present tax abatement property may not be reentered into a 'follow-on' tax abatement at this time. The property that is now in the expiring JOBZ program may be placed into tax abatement.

I advocate for tax abatement on the eligible MWTC property for the following reasons:

- 1. Prior to the sale of the former Willmar Regional Treatment Center, the State of Minnesota commissioned a reuse study. The study predicted it would take more than \$30 million to counter the effects of deferred maintenance on the property's unused buildings. Roughly half of the MWTC buildings have been renovated and just over \$16 million has been spent. It appears the \$30 million predicted to be spent on the campus buildings and infrastructure will be correct.
- 2. MWTC has created 460 jobs at an average wage of just over \$50,000 per year. The economic impact felt by our extended community is self-evident, but I will present what I consider to be conservative numbers.
  - 460 (jobs) X \$50,000 (average wage) = \$23 million (total wages paid) X 2 (multiplier factor\*) =
     \$46 million direct economic impact in our extended community

\*multiplier factor = the figure used by government to measure the realized impact of wages in an area. If MWTC pays \$23 million in direct wages, it will 'bounce' in the community as the money is being spent and invested and the net impact will be twice the original wage received. Please feel free to check with the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development on the wage multiplier effect. I believe you will find I have used a quite conservative multiplier. It is common to hear multipliers of double and even triple the multiplier (2) that I use, but I have never had

a problem with justifying my figure and I think a \$46 million impact on our extended community is quite large and quantifiable.

• To receive the new tax abatement, MWTC has agreed to create at least 175 additional new jobs. They, as well, will continue to rehab the MWTC buildings and infrastructure with the net result of additional future property taxes.

The following is the information I have and I will amend the numbers prior to the requested public hearing, if I find they need correction:

## Present (expiring 12/31/15) tax abatement:

Kandiyohi County	\$82,405
City of Willmar	\$47,348
ISD No. 347	\$33,380

The present tax-abated property may not be reentered (immediately) into a follow-on tax abatement program and the amount indicated would be paid to the respective public entities.

## Requesting tax abatement on the former JOBZ property:

Kandiyohi County	\$68,357
City of Willmar	\$42,449
ISD No. 347	\$19,761

I believe the protocol is to request a public hearing to consider the tax abatement request and to announce its financial consequence to Kandiyohi County. I waited until today to send you this because I wanted to be able to report the City of Willmar approved a 10-year, 100% tax abatement for MWTC at last night's City Council meeting. Again, I believe the numbers I have presented to be accurate and it is my intent to provide you with this information as soon as possible so you may alert the County Commissioners and Senior Administration of the intent to request tax abatement for MWTC, but will amend my memo if I find more correct information in the next few days. I believe the county will receive the formerly tax-abated funds (\$82,405 annually) it is being asked to tax abate the portion of MWTC property that was in the JOBZ program (\$68,357 annually).
