Chair Les Nelson called the meeting to order at approximately 11:15 a.m.

MINUTES—

IT WAS MOVED BY Roger Imdieke, SECONDED BY Ranae Rahn, to approve the minutes of the January 20, 2016 meeting as emailed. MOTION CARRIED.

REPORTS—

BRE visitation program update. Connie Schmoll reported that progress continues on the projects that have been developed. The EDC has partnered with Vision 2040 to plan and coordinate the 2016 Manufacturing Day, which is scheduled for October 7, 2016. Area high school teachers will tour selected manufacturing companies in August. Students will tour the companies on October 5 or 12. The EDC's new website is now up and committee members were encouraged to check out the website. The EDC will help promote the Willmar Lakes Area Chamber of Commerce on an upcoming high school job fair which will also be open to college students. The EDC has participated in the Green Card Voices project with Vision 2040 to help promote and embrace the cultural diversity in our community and as a BRE program response.

Atwater BRE program. Schmoll announced she will give a presentation to the Atwater Chamber of Commerce on April 25, 2016, regarding the Atwater BRE program. Discussion held regarding the new Dollar General Store coming into Atwater and what, if any, impact it may have on smaller businesses in Atwater.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Review of 2015 goals and develop 2016 goals. The 2015 BRE/R Goals were briefly reviewed (see attached). Schmoll suggested not expanding the BRE Visitation Program at this time as cities are not asking a visitation program. Backman is planning to attend area city council meetings to introduce himself and share EDC's goals and programs. Backman provided background and an update of the Shovel-Ready process for 200 acres in Willmar's Industrial Park and 86 acres of the old airport. Minnesota's Shovel-Ready Certification program began in 2009; currently 29 cities across the state have certified sites. Sites certified by the Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) have the planning, zoning, surveys, title work, environmental studies, soils analysis and public infrastructure engineering completed prior to the sites going up for sale. The Willmar City Council approved the city's participation in the Shovel-Ready Certification program for Willmar's Industrial Park and will fund \$8,026 in professional services. The EDC will fund the remaining half and \$3,250 for the program's application fee. Roger Imdieke stated the shovel-ready sites are critical to the community especially with the construction of the Willmar Wye Project. Discussion held on recruitment efforts in Kandiyohi County, specifically the marketing of the Willmar Airport to attract other air-related businesses. Backman recently toured the facility and visited with a current business owner located at the airport. Backman expressed interest to bring in air cargo to the Willmar Airport as one way to drive business to the airport. Discussion held on reformatting the BRE/R Committee to include transportation. Imdieke commented it may be beneficial for a group to travel to Washington, DC to lobby for funds to complete the Highway 23 four-lane project between New London and Richmond. The EDC Joint Powers Board and the Joint Operations Board will conduct a Strategic Planning Session on April 21, 2016. Once the 2016 EDC goals are formalized, the BRE/R Committee will address its 2016 goals.
