Connie Schmoll called the meeting to order at approximately 12:00 p.m. Schmoll informed the committee that Ashley Queenan resigned from the committee due to time commitments with a new full-time job and introduced Melissa Knott as a new committee member followed by self introductions. Knott is the Director of Marketing for Christianson PLLP.

MINUTES

IT WAS MOVED BY Donna Boonstra, SECONDED BY Ryan Thielen, to approve the February 27 and March 27, 2017 minutes as e-mailed. MOTION CARRIED.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Agriculture & Renewable Energy Flyer. Jean Geselius reviewed changes made by the EDC's Agriculture and Renewable Energy Development (Ag) Marketing Subcommittee to the Diverse Agriculture & Renewable Energy Opportunities flyer (see attached). Jayme Sczublewski will check on the proper names to use for RELCO and Jennie-O and make changes in the flyer, if necessary. This flyer coordinates with the trifold display recently done for the Ag Committee. Schmoll will use the flyer at tradeshows she attends and requested 100 copies be printed. It was recommended that the two icons on the front page line up with the two text paragraphs.

NEW BUSINESS

Budget. As the committee will be discussing expenditures, Schmoll noted the committee's budget for 2017 is \$26,925 and REDstar is at 64% of \$12,000, the amount budgeted for their services.

Minnesota Thriving in the North Ad. Schmoll stated the EDC was contacted to again advertise in the Minnesota Thriving in the North magazine published by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED). Ad costs are \$5,995 for a full page, \$4,255 for a vertical half page or \$3,750 for a horizontal half page; there is no web only option. The publication date of the magazine is November 2017. The EDC's previous full-page ad was shown (see attached) and the online link at http://livability.com/mnDEED was viewed. It was noted the EDC's link appears twice on the website's homepage.

IT WAS MOVED BY Ryan Thielen, seconded by Jean Geselius, to purchase a half page vertical ad at a cost of \$4,255 to include tracking information, a new creative look and add information on area lakes or possibly the 2018 Governor's Fishing Opener. MOTION CARRIED.

Knott recommended there be a way to track how effective the ad is and how many hits it receives via telephone and social media. The same ad format has been used for two years with changes to photos.

Social Media Strategies. Sczublewski stated she and Lindsey Donner reviewed all of the social media platforms, audited the EDC's performance on each and developed some strategies for what they determine is important for the EDC (see attached). Sczublewski created a LinkedIn page for the EDC, which will be the focus of the social media platform and will be used to recruit businesses. Sczublewski and Donner recommend a marketing calendar be created with what themes each post should follow and who should post them and then review the strategy in six to eight weeks. The goal is to distribute content, obtain followers, be a community resource and drive viewers to the EDC's website. It was suggested that the following be included as social partners in the strategy: Vision 2040, Kandiyohi County Creating Entrepreneurial Opportunities, 1 Million Cups and WORKUP. Schmoll noted the Ag Committee would like to obtain emails of individuals who access the Ag Producer BRE Report online and categorize their interest. Sczublewski and Donner will start the program using content from the EDC's website.

IT WAS MOVED BY Ryan Thielen, SECONDED BY Emily Lien, to move forward with developing a social media calendar. MOTION CARRIED.

ADJOURNMENT—There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 12:52 p.m.

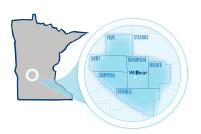

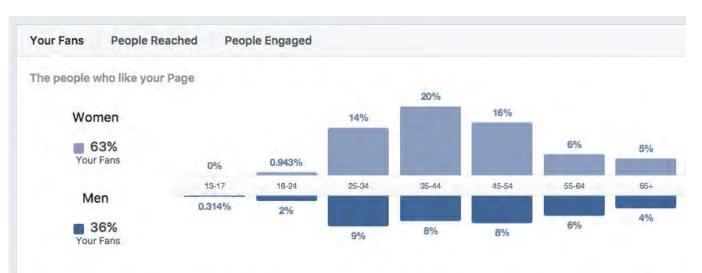

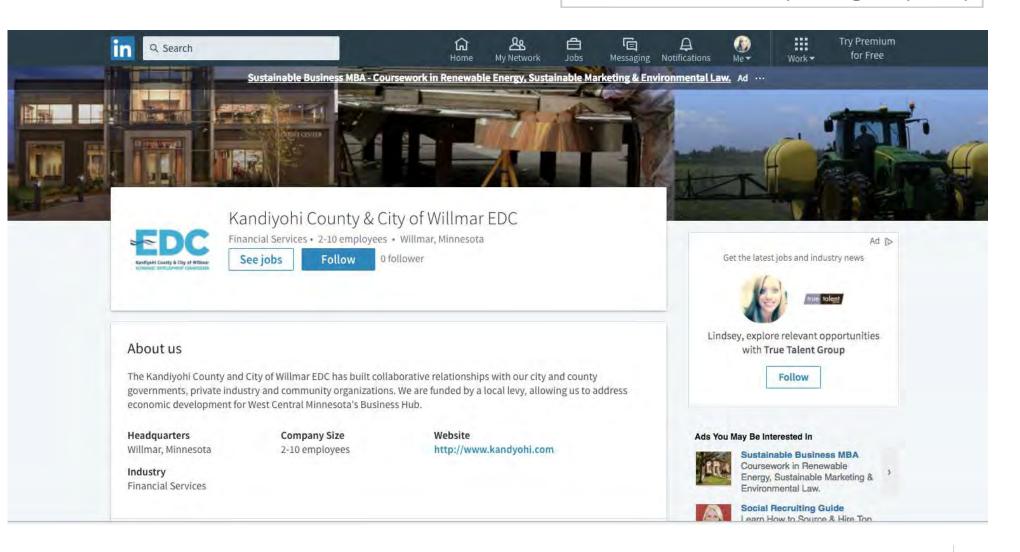
