Kandiyohi and Gennessee townships were included in the 2024 Round 10 awards of the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) Border-to-Border Broadband Grant program. You can find details on this award at the West Central Tribune.

These awards join locations in the townships of Colfax, Dovre, Lake Andrew and Norway Lake and the nearly completed project in Fahlun Township from Round 9 and bring the number of served locations to over 2,600.


